A Reflection from Fr. Paul

In these past weeks, it has struck me how fast time flies. Advent was as short as it could be: 3 weeks. Christmas time was only 2 weeks and a day. Now Lent is almost upon us (Ash Wednesday is February 14th).

Each of these seasons reminds us of an essential aspect of our spiritual life. In Advent we prepare to celebrate the first coming of Christ, while reminding ourselves how important it is to prepare for His second coming. The celebration of Christmas reminds us that Christ came to save all people and we, in our baptism, committed ourselves to cooperate in that project by living in such a way as to bring Christ to those around us.

But that is hard and we often fail. Lent is the time for us to reflect on the times we have failed and seek forgiveness, asking ourselves what we can do to make sure we do better in the future. Lent begins with us being marked by ashes, reminding us that our life is temporary and we need to continually work to fulfill our baptismal commitment to bring Christ to the world. A common practice is to accept a voluntary penance as a sign of our desire to be a better person (children often give up candy, adults liquor).

This Lent I invite us to consider doing something positive in place of, or better yet, in addition to giving something up. For example, are there relatives, neighbors, or friends who are homebound and would enjoy some visits? Are there neighbors who could use help with some chores around the house? Is there a ministry I can volunteer for in my parish or a non-profit that serves the poor that could use my time and skills?

In short, let us make this Lent a time of reaching out and giving, not just giving up. May our observance of Lent make our celebration of Easter more meaningful. God bless.

Finances

As is normally the case, with year-end/holiday giving and one of our quarterly Kingdom Prep High School rent checks, income in December was substantial (\$144,511). Though when compared to the budget, stewardship still lags about \$5,000 behind our budgeted pace. Our expenses continue to stay on pace to the budget.

What does that "substantial" December income cover? Well, some of our expenses this time of year include our...

- Annual property/liability insurance bill was \$25,593
- Average monthly payroll is about \$29,000
- Electricity bill has been averaging \$3,400/month
- Average monthly gas bill in the winter is \$6,750

All this plus the many thousands spent in support of our numerous ministries. Blessings on your generosity!

Our Finance Council made the decision to pull most of our savings out of the market and instead invest in money market and laddered CD pools at rates varying from 4.05-5.5%. While, in the end, we did not lose any principal with our previous investment in the Catholic Community Foundation, it did bounce around considerably over the past 20 months. It was felt that with favorable MM/CD rates and in these uncertain times, that we should secure the principal and take advantage of known/assured rates of return.

If you have not already done so, please return your stewardship pledge for 2024! You can use the card you received, pledge online at www.stpiusparish.org/stewardship.html, call or email me. As we start the budget process for our 2024-2025 fiscal year, it is important that we have as clear an understanding as possible of our anticipated income as we project our ministry expenses.

Pius Continues to Support Catholic School Education!

We are in the middle of registration periods for Catholic elementary schools for the 2024/25 school year. Do you have or want to place your child in a Catholic elementary school? Please be aware that we have funds to financially assist St Pius families who choose to send their child(ren) to a Catholic elementary school at another parish. Pius will cover any school's "non-parishioner tuition penalty"! Additional assistance is also available for even the base tuition costs.

In addition, we would like to know of our Pius families that are attending a Catholic high school. There may be some assistance available for you as well.

And, as mentioned in Fr. Paul's update, there is also a full (4 yr) scholarship available for a student attending either DSHA or MUHS (as an incoming freshman next fall).

Faith Formation

I would like to spend more time in daily prayer, you might also want to. My wife is wonderfully dedicated to her morning ritual of spiritual readings, meditation and sun salutations. This daily practice is evident in her calmness. I wish I was as dedicated to my mental and spiritual health. We know that Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. However, how do we do this? It can be rote; simply praying in our normal daily/weekly way, eating fish, donating an extra few dollars to a cause. This year I think we should follow the Lenten practice of prayer, fasting and almsgiving with mindfulness, or with the practice of contemplative living. How can we experience the awe of Lent without slowing down and mindfully practicing it? Contemplative living will be a focus of Lenten faith formation this year, including our Ash Wednesday reflection, weekly Scripture conversation, Sunday morning videos, an evening reflection, Stations of the Cross and other Lenten opportunities. 



Food Insecurity

The Justice & Peace Commission continues to learn about the issue of food insecurity. We have decided to roll out the first phase of this initiative during Lent as the Lenten themes of prayer, fasting and almsgiving match well with our topic.

During each week of Lent, we will provide information and suggested actions along with a prayer. Topics will include items such as

- What is food insecurity?
- How does food insecurity affect child development?
- What is the degree of food insecurity in Wauwatosa and the city of Milwaukee?

Future planning may include a "hunger banquet", a tour and possible working at an urban garden project, and a panel discussion in the fall. We will provide details on those items as they are finalized and hope you will join us!
